Over three decades ago this dream began, and it started with a fateful handshake between two friends.

The idea of <u>K</u>athaumixw was born because Don James, music director of the Powell River Academy of Music, wanted to establish an international choral festival in North America that would be on par with festivals he and the Academy Choirs had experienced in Europe. While hiking with his friend Dal Matterson, and inspired by the beauty of their surroundings, Don suggested to Dal that they organize an international choral festival in Powell River. Dal agreed to be chairman of the festival, and in 1984 the two men, with a group of close friends and the Powell River Academy of Music, successfully organized and launched the first International Choral <u>K</u>athaumixw.

What happened next was beyond anyone's expectations.

The Powell River Academy of Music is pleased to present the XVII International Choral <u>K</u>athaumixw festival.



### Paul Cummings CANADA

Paul Cummings, recipient of the BC Music Educators' 1995 Outstanding Music Educator Award, has degrees in Music and Education from the University of British Columbia, and a Masters Degree in Choral Conducting from Western Washington University, Bellingham. Paul studied trombone with jazz great Dave Robbins in the 80's before beginning his career as a music educator at Harzic Secondary School in Mission, BC. In 1999/2000, Paul directed the Western Washington University

Vocal Jazz Ensemble. His premiere vocal ensembles have enjoyed successful showcase performances at Festival Arnhem 2001 in Holland, Europa Cantat Choir Festival 1994 (Denmark), 1997 (Austria), 2003 (Spain), 2005 (Belgium), 2007 (Slovenia), 2010 (Spain), 2012 (Italy), 2014 (France), Canadian Rocky Mountain Music Festival, and the BC Vocal Jazz Festival. As coordinator of the BC Vocal Jazz Festival, Paul attracted artists such as Carol Welsman, Just 4 Kicks, and the New York Voices.

Mr Cummings has enjoyed adjudicating at the Whitehorse Rotary Music Festival, Festival Nelson, Powell River International Vocal Jazz Summit, Surrey Jazz Festival, Salmon Arm Music Festival and the Langley District Jazz Festival. Paul currently teaches music at Brooks Secondary School, the Powell River Academy of Music and is an instructor at Vancouver Island University.

# MUSIC DIRECTOR, POWELL RIVER ACADEMY OF MUSIC; FESTIVAL MUSIC ADVISOR

### Walter Martella CANADA

Walter Martella, conductor and Music Director of the Powell River Academy of Music, has long been an integral part of Powell River's musical community. He is an accomplished pianist, accordionist and trumpeter, starting lessons at age five, and soon joining the original Boys Choir conducted by Don James. Music remained his fo-



cus as he earned a Diploma in Jazz Trumpet from Malaspina College (VIU), a Bachelor of Music Degree from the University of Victoria and attended the Banff School of Fine Arts.

Conducting became a significant part of Martella's life and career when he returned to Powell River to study at PRAM under Don James. He has participated in the British Columbia Choral Federation's conducting program and has collaborated with world-renowned conductors. He has led noteworthy works like Holst's Rig Veda for choir and harp, the Messiah, Schubert's Mass in G, and Vivaldi's Gloria. He conducts the Academy Chamber Choir, Chor Musica Men's Choir and the Powell River Chorus as well as currently maintaining a full private teaching schedule.

Martella is a strong believer in the power of music as an important part of community. He has been an adjudicator for instrumental and choral festivals throughout British Columbia and is well known as an enthusiastic mentor, making room for his young students in his own public performances. He has recorded five jazz CDs, performed provincially with many well-known musicians in multiple genres and continues to be in demand all along the West Coast as a trumpet soloist and jazz pianist.

### JURY & SOLOISTS

### Scott Leithead CANADA

Scott Leithead is the founder and Artistic Director of Edmonton's Kokopelli Choir Association and TIME (Today's Innovative Music Edmonton) Association. As lecturer and presenter, Mr Leithead has appeared at major conferences, symposiums and universities across Canada and beyond. Mr Leithead has worked with choirs in South Africa and Namibia on numerous occasions since 2005. His passion for innovative and unique choral mu-



sic experiences has shaped the direction of the Kokopelli Choir Association. Currently the Vice-Chairman of Choral/Vocal Division for MusicFest Canada, he is a long-time member of the advisory committee for the Canadian Rocky Mountain Music Festival.

Mr Leithead is also the President of the Brail Tone Music Society for persons with disabilities and serves on three national boards in Canada as well as the National Youth Music and Art Development Foundation of South Africa.



### Sanna Valvanne FINLAND


Sanna Valvanne is an innovative conductor from Finland, specialized in children's and youth choirs. She is recognized worldwide for her holistic and creative choral method: "Sing and Shine With Body and Soul", which combines vocal expression with movement and drama. She is a popular clinician and guest conductor with choirs


around the world. Sanna's special Warm Ups are published as a DVD and available from her website. Her new Sing & Shine Repertoire DVD along with scores for Sanna's popular arrangements were published in June 2015 also on her website.

Sanna has her Master's Degree in Music from the Sibelius Academy in Helsinki. She is a graduate from the world-famous Tapiola Choir. Sanna sang in the choir for 13 years and continued as its vocal trainer and conductor's assistant to both Professor Erkki Pohjola and Kari Ala-Pöllänen.

### Chad Louwerse CANADA

Canadian Bass-Baritone, Chad Louwerse debuted in Europe with l'Opéra National du Rhin in Strasbourg as Bernadino in Berlioz' Benvenuto Cellini. In Canada he has been heard from Quebec to British Columbia. Chad is a winner of both the CBC Westcoast Performance Pacific Spotlight competition and the Debut competition and has given recitals broadcast on CBC Radio Two.







### Ay-Laung Wang CANADA

Ay-Laung Wang is an active organ recitalist, conductor, adjudicator and teacher. Her outstanding musicianship, brilliant technique, and great personal charm make her a favourite with audiences and congregations wherever she performs.

Currently Ms Wang is principal organist for the Vancouver Symphony Orchestra and First Baptist Church. In addition, she is a member of the faculty of Trinity Western University and Assistant Conductor for the acclaimed TWU Chamber and Concert Choirs. Ms

Wang received her MMus in organ performance with distinction from the University of British Columbia.



### Megan Skidmore CANADA

Megan Skidmore obtained both her Bachelor's and Master's degrees in Voice Performance from McGill University. She continued her studies at the Wiener Meisterkurze in Vienna, the Mozarteum in Salzburg and the Franz Schubert Institut in Baden bei Wien.

While in Montreal she had great success as Feu and Rossignol in L'Enfant et les Sortilèges, Cunegonde in Candide and Sara Riel in Louis Riel with Opera McGill. She also performed the title role in Princess Ida and Josephine in HMS Pinafore with McGill's Savoy Society.

Ms Skidmore regularly performs in oratorio and recitals. Megan joined the faculty of the Powell River Academy of Music in 2009; she teaches voice and conducts the Powell River Girls Choir and the Academy Singers.



### Don James, CM, FOUNDER & ARTISTIC DIRECTOR EMERITUS

Don James, CM settled in Powell River after graduating in Orchestral Conducting from the University of Washington in the early 1970s. Over the past 37 years he has enjoyed a successful career as a conductor, music educator and musical entrepreneur. He is the Founder and Artistic Director Emeritus, Powell River Academy of Music, International Choral Kathaumixw and Symphony Orchestra & Opera Academy of the Pacific and is currently President of the Board of Directors of the Powell River Academy of Music. He has served as president of the Association of Canadian Choral Conductors, the British Columbia Association



of Community Music Schools and, for a decade, was Canada's representative on the Board of Directors of the International Federation for Choral Music. He is currently a member of the Music Council of the World Choir Games.

Mr James has been a juror for the Juno Awards, CBC National Choir Competition, Miedzyzdroje Festival of Song in Poland, the national choral competitions of Sweden and the Choir Olympics in Korea and in China. Mr James is the recipient of the Willan Award and Canada's highest honour, the Order of Canada, in recognition of his distinguished service to music. Mr James has recently been named a 2016 recipient of the BC Community Achievement Awards for his contributions to Powell River's cultural community. His vision for teaching music and developing an Academy and Festival has put Powell River on the world map and influenced the lives of all his students, their families and the community at large.

### KATHAUMIXW COMPOSERS

### Sarah Quartel CANADA

Canadian composer, conductor and educator Sarah Quartel is known for her fresh and exciting approach to the choral experience. Sarah celebrates the musical potential of all learners by providing singers access to high quality repertoire and engaging music education. Her works are performed throughout the world and her curriculum documents are used to connect the excitement of choral festivals with meaningful classroom learning.

In summer 2014, Sarah's work "Snow Angel" was performed at the prestigious World Symposium on Choral Music in Seoul, South Korea. In 2015 her ACDA commissioned work "Wide Open Spaces" received its premiere performance under the baton of Bob Chilcott at the American Choral Directors Association national conference in Salt Lake City. Sarah is published with Oxford University Press, an educator in Eastern Ontario and a regular guest clinician at various music education and choral events internationally.

### Tobin Stokes CANADA

Tobin Stokes trained as a classical & Latin percussionist, choral singer, and jazz pianist and vibraphonist before becoming a full-time freelance composer almost twenty years ago. Based on Canada's west coast, he writes for film, opera, orchestra, choir, television, theatre, dance, chamber ensembles, soloists, and large events. He has been commissioned by the 2010 Olympics, the Victoria Symphony, the Elektra Women's Choir, CBC Radio, the Victoria Symphony, the XV Commonwealth Games, Ballet British Columbia, and more. He has scored films and series for the BBC, CBC, ABC (Australia), with broadcasts on many other networks.

Tobin's commissioned works for the Powell River Academy of Music including cantatas, staged choral works, symphonies, chamber and choral works have premiered in France, England, Czech Republic, Japan, Sweden and Venezuela as well as at the International Choral Kathaumixw.

### THE FESTIVAL TROPHY

<u>Kathaumixw</u> has adopted the thunderbird as its festival logo. Native myths regard the thunderbird as the supreme bird of all birds. The thunderbird created land for man to stand upon, used lightning and thunder to protect man from supernatural beings and was kind and helpful. The thunderbird sits upon the mountain tops, spreads his wings and protects all.

The <u>Kathaumixw</u> thunderbird is an original design created by First Nations artist William D Finn. The permanent festival trophy is carved from carbonaceous slate (argillite) found in Haida Gwaii and the central United States.

### Artubus Brass Quintet • CANADA

The 2016 Kathaumixw Brass Ensemble is comprised of freelance musicians and brass educators based in Vancouver: Al Cannon and Jeremy Vint on trumpet, Nick Anderson on horn, Ellen Marple on trombone, and Drew Dumas on tuba. Members regularly perform with the Vancouver Opera Orchestra, Vancouver Symphony Orchestra, Vancouver New Music, and as principal players with numerous regional orchestras in British Columbia. ### Novel Voz • CUBA

<u>Kathaumixw</u> 2016's Artist in Residence is the premiere Cuban vocal jazz ensemble, Novel Voz. This high-energy and physical ensemble has inspired audiences around the world.

Novel Voz (Spanish for new voice) is a talented seven-voice ensemble made up of four men and three women. The group has been making a cappella music together for the past eight years and have recorded two CDs. Their repertoire includes traditional Cuban songs and an array of international pieces. They have been described as a "vocal orchestra" and easily live up to the name by performing vocal imitations of instruments such as percussion, strings, and piano to accompany their singing.



### New Zealand Secondary Students' Choir

The New Zealand Secondary Students' Choir is a national, auditioned choir for secondary school students (aged 13 to 19). Through excellence, professionalism, collaboration, resilience and advocacy, they aim to extend secondary students' choral excellence and to develop their leadership capabilities as key contributors to the New Zealand arts sector. Approximately 60 members join for a two year cycle, gathering for a week of rehearsals and concerts every school holiday break (approximately three weeks per year). At the end of the two year cycle, members tour internationally. Past international tours include Kathaumixw in

2010 where they were awarded the first People's Choice Award.



### ANDREW WITHINGTON, CONDUCTOR

Andrew Withington has directed the NZSSC since 2008. He is currently studying towards a doctorate in choral pedagogy at the University of Canterbury, NZ, where he also teaches conducting and musicianship. He is in high demand as a choral conductor, adjudicator and clinician and has previously sung in NZ's national youth and chamber choirs.



### **Academy Chamber Choir**

The Academy Chamber Choir, conducted by Walter Martella, consists of 39 singers from a wide variety of backgrounds and professions. It is an amateur choir that, since its inception in 1994, has developed into one of Canada's dynamic chamber choirs. The choir has had the privilege of working with such celebrated conductors as the late Elmer Iseler (Canada), Jesper Jorgensen (Denmark), Jan Szyrocki (Poland) and Fred Sjoberg (Sweden). The choir has toured in Venezuela, Czech Republic, Sweden, Canada, Mexico, Spain and France.

The Choir specializes in a cappella music from the Middle Ages to the 20th century and regularly commissions new works by Canadian composers. They frequently collaborate with soloists, instrumentalists and other choirs in the performance of major choral works such as Carl Orff's Carmina Burana, Francis Poulenc's Gloria and Felix Mendelssohn's Elijah.

### WALTER MARTELLA, CONDUCTOR

Walter Martella, conductor and Music Director of the Powell River Academy of Music, is a pianist, trumpeter, and accordionist. He is one of the great gems of the Sunshine Coast and has taken the stage with many world class musicians and conductors. Walter is a strong believer in the power of music as part of community. He is a graduate of Banff School, Vancouver Island University, University of Victoria and the BCCF conducting program.

### Powell River Youth Choir



The Powell River Youth Choir is a thirty voice mixed choir with members ranging in age from 15 to 18. The choir specializes in a cappella music from the Middle Ages to the 20th century and regularly commissions new works by Canadian composers. ### **Academy Singers**





The Academy Singers have been important ambassadors for Powell River. The choir is conducted by Megan Skidmore.

### MEGAN SKIDMORE, CONDUCTOR

Megan Skidmore obtained both her Bachelor's and Master's degrees in Voice Performance from McGill University. She continued her studies at the Wiener Meisterkurze in Vienna, the Mozarteum in Salzburg and the Franz Schubert Institut in Baden bei Wien. She has collaborated with pianist Sarah Hagen for a number of performances in the Comox Valley.

Ms Skidmore was raised in the Comox Valley and returned in 2007 as a private voice teacher. 


### Bloemfontein Children's Choir • SOUTH AFRICA

### Jubilate Vocal Ensemble • CANADA




### BRIDGET O'SHANASSY, CONDUCTOR

Choral music is her passion, and she currently directs five choirs in the city, ranging from children to adults.

### Powell River Chorus • CANADA



In 1955, the Ethel Eason Singers, directed by school teacher Virginia Farmer, and a few teachers and students led by Lyle Henderson joined their voices and named themselves the Powell River Choral Society. In 2016 the now named Powell River Chorus boasts over 80 members. The choir remains a non-auditioned community choir and regularly competes in local music festivals, presents two concerts annually, and performs at numerous hospitals, seniors' centers and civic functions throughout Powell River. The choir has sung for royalty, at Expo '86 as 'core choir' for the opening ceremonies and recorded three successive radio broadcasts over CBC's "Parade of Choirs." The repertoire is varied and the Chorus boasts one of the largest collections of choral music in BC.

### WALTER MARTELLA, CONDUCTOR

Conductor Walter Martella is especially active in Powell River's music scene. Walter is a versatile, experienced musician involved in genres of music ranging from classical and choral to jazz. Accompanist Maryna Gray holds a Master's Degree in piano pedagogy and accompanying from the Kharkiv State Institute of the Arts, Ukraine.

### Robinson Singers • USA

The Robinson Singers is comprised of students in grades nine through twelve with varied backgrounds and interests who share a common love for singing choral music. The ensemble has earned consistent superior ratings at state music assessments and has been recognized with prestigious performance opportunities and awards. They have performed at the Kennedy Center for the Performing Arts and the Virginia Music Educators' Association Professional Development Conference. In 2012 and 2014 the ensemble earned a silver medal at the World Choir Games in Cincinnati, Ohio in the Champions Level Competition. The ensemble has performed at music festivals throughout the United States earning numerous first place awards and superior ratings.



### MIKE HORANSKI, CONDUCTOR

Mike Horanski is a native of Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania where he began both vocal and instrumental study at a very early age, leading to the pursuit of a music degree and a continued interest in both music performance and music education. Horanski has been conducting the Robinson Singers since 2005.

In 2015, with help from a grant from The Wolf Trap Foundation, the Robinson Singers and Select Women's Ensemble commissioned composer Sydney Guillaume to write a double choir piece titled Musique which was premiered in June, 2015. They are also conducted by Mike Horanski.

# Wah Yan College Kowloon Boys Choir • China Hong Kong



Established in 1955, the Wah Yan College Kowloon Boys' Choir has become one of the most celebrated boys' school choirs in the territory. The choir won Gold in the 2008 HK International Youth & Children's Choir Festival and 6th World Choir Games; championship in the 9th Busan Choir Festival in 2010; and great success as champions in the 2011 3rd HK International Youth and Children's

Choir Festival. In 2012, the choir won two Gold Medals at the 7th World Choir Games (Male Youth Choir and Musica Sacra).


### Willamette Master Chorus • USA
